PARTICIPATION OF HANDICAPPED STUDENTS IN COMPETENCY BASED EDUCATION PROGRAMS (CBE)

Every handicapped student should have the opportunity to participate in the Competency Based Education program to the maximum extent possible. Alternative methods of competency testing and demonstration of competency should be available to handicapped students so that the competency level is being tested rather than the handicap.

- A. A student is considered to be "handicapped" if he/she is below twenty-two years of age and has one or more of the following handicaps;
 - 1. Deaf
 - 2. Deaf-Blind
 - Developmentally Handicapped
 - 4. Hearing Impaired
 - 5. Multiply Handicapped
 - 6. Orthopedically Handicapped
 - 7. Other Health Handicapped
 - 8. Sever Behavior Handicapped
 - 9. Specific Learning Disability
 - 10. Speech Handicapped
 - 11. Visually Handicapped
- A. A handicapped student may be on an <u>individual</u> basis exempted from one, part, or all of the competency based education program. The extent of participation in competency based education will be determined every year during the Individualized Education Program (IEP) meeting.
- B. If a handicapped student is to participate in the competency based education, any necessary modifications in the testing procedures will be indicated on the individualized education program. The following is a guideline:

	1.	at time of day most beneficial to student.
	2.	in periods of minutes followed by rest periods.
	3.	until, in the examiner's judgement, the student can no longer sustain the activity due to physical or attention span limitations.

D.	For handicapped students attending cooperative programs, the student should participate in the competency based education program in the district of attendance.			
E.	A handicapped student would be permitted to participate in the competency based education program at the level that is closest to his/her performance level. For example, a fifth grade developmentally handicapped student may take the third grade competency based education tests.			
F.	A tracking system is needed so that the areas of competency based education that were waived and/or needed testing modifications could be noted.			
G.	The same procedures would be followed for those students who are temporarily "handicapped," i.e., Other Health Handicapped/pregnancy.			
H.	If a student is no longer eligible for Special Education placement, gradual integration into the competency based education program will be instigated.			
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
