

SUMMER SCHOOLS

The Board may operate summer schools for students in grades one through twelve. Summer programs can be for students who need extra help in order to advance with their respective age groups or to provide enrichment, remedial and recreational experiences.

In general, no tuition is charged students who are residents of the District and whose need for a summer program has been identified by teachers and who have been recommended for enrollment in the program to the Superintendent by the appropriate building principal. A fee for consumable materials may be charged. Special activities or programs for which a fee is to be charged may be conducted only with the approval of the Board.

Summer school is under the direction of the principal of the building where summer school is held.

Students eligible for the summer school of the District include:

1. resident students eligible for regular attendance in the public schools of the District;
2. students eligible by standards established by the governmental funding source;
3. nonresident students whose age or grade level is appropriate to the course of study applied for and
4. summer residents of the District, provided that the attendance of such students will not preclude the attendance of resident students.

Promotion and retention at grade level may be contingent upon successful completion of summer school.

The Board does not accept responsibility for the transportation of any students.

The Superintendent/designee is responsible for developing regulations for planning the summer school curriculum; recommending appropriate staff appointments; suggesting methods of instruction; student and staff assignments; evaluation and reporting on student progress; utilization of facilities; and determination of tuition rates.

Such regulations for the operation of the summer school are consistent with Board policies, and the operation of summer school shall not conflict in any way with the administration of the regular school sessions of the District.
