DIPLOMA OF ADULT EDUCATION

The Board grants a Diploma of Adult Education to any adult who has completed the required 24 units for earning a high school diploma. These 24 units can consist of no more than six equivalent high school credits for adult students' life experiences. The life experiences may include work and volunteer experience; completion of academic, vocational or self-improvement courses and other experiences judged by the Board as providing knowledge, learning experiences and competencies comparable to those gained in the classroom. Schools staff evaluate the applicant's application for the Diploma of Adult Education. Each application must be approved by the Superintendent.

To be eligible to receive equivalent high school credits for the Diploma of Adult Education an applicant must be at least 22 years old, be a resident of the district and not have been issued a high school certificate or attendance or diploma.

The District must make provisions to administer, at no fee, the Ohio High School Graduation Qualifying Examination to any eligible adult with exceptions for disabled persons. The adult must pass all subtests of the Ohio High School Graduation Qualifying Examination.
